Annual Picnic

Our traditional summer picnic took place on Sunday, August 14 at the Dexter-Huron Metropark. Over 60 people attended this event, many of them new to the area. On a beautiful summer afternoon we had opportunity to meet, share stories, sample delicious picnic food, and in general had a lot of fun. The additional attraction was a raffle – the “Mystery Basket”, which was won by a young family new to Ann Arbor. Congratulation and welcome! The raffle brought over \$150 to our Chapter’s coffers.

Lecture on Polish emigration

Our long-time member Patricia Yocum presented a lecture “A Well-Worn Path: Migration from Two Villages in Galicia, 1898-1924”. It took place on October 21 at the Ann Arbor District Library Downtown.

At the height of the transatlantic migration Dobrzechów and Kożuchów, two villages in in modern-day Podkarpackie Province, Poland, sent many of their people to America. Nearly 300 of these people, entering at New York City from 1898 to 1924, have been identified in Ellis Island records. Using ship manifests, filled out as the travelers boarded their ships, two studies examined who these migrants were, where they were going and whom they were joining. The patterns which emerged suggest a great deal about the nature of immigration during the period of study as well as the forces which propelled it.

Patricia Yocum is librarian emerita at the University of Michigan and a long-time member of PACAA. In retirement she

has pursued research into Polish immigration history especially that from Galicia, the native region of her Polish ancestors. Her papers on migration from Dobrzechów and Kozuchów have been published in *Polish American Studies*. She is currently researching the life these villagers led post-arrival in the United States, focusing on those who went to Thorndike, MA.

Bonfire/ Ognisko

At the beginning of fall, members of the Polish community have an opportunity to meet and enjoy our traditional fall bonfire – ognisko. It took place on September 24 at the Brighton Recreational Area, on the beautiful meadow surrounding the Migizi cabin, a short walk from Bishop Lake. The event was attended by over 40 people, our long-time members and many new faces! We enjoyed the beautiful fall afternoon, walking in the woods, hunting for mushrooms, talking and sharing a variety of picnic foods – especially Polish sausages roasted on the stick! After the sundown we gathered around the bonfire singing old and new Polish songs.
