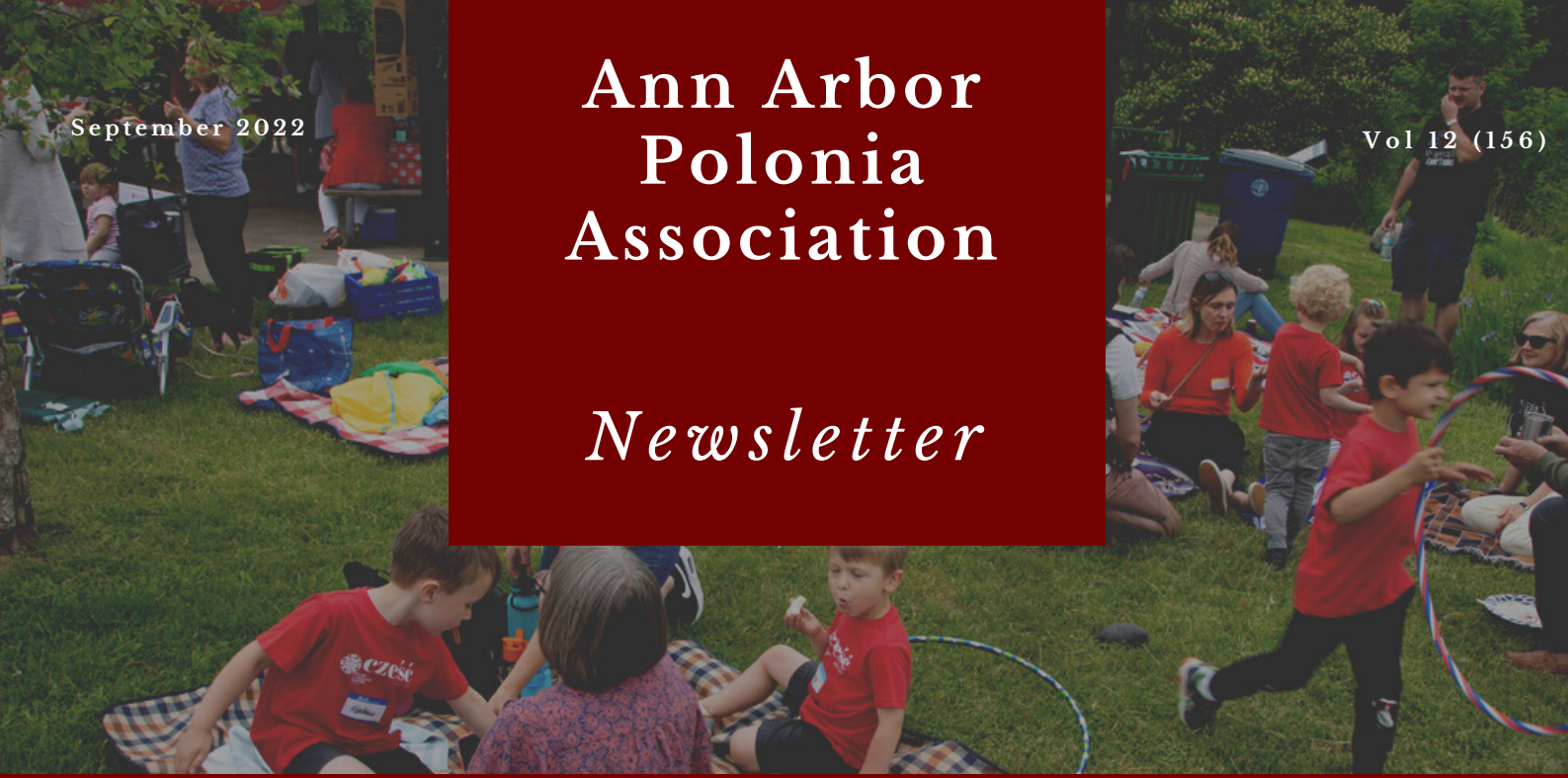

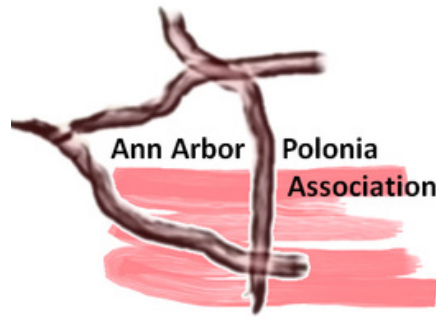

Run for Hope

The AAPA co-sponsored the Ann Arbor “Run For Hope” event, a bike/run/walk fundraiser for Ukraine, on May 22nd. The happening was organized by volunteers and past board members of the AAPA, including Inka Kryczek, and volunteers from the Polish Cultural Fund – Ann Arbor, the Polish Language Center of Ann Arbor, and Old St. Patrick Parish. A total of over \$1300 was raised to support Ukrainian refugees.

Polonijny Piknik 2022

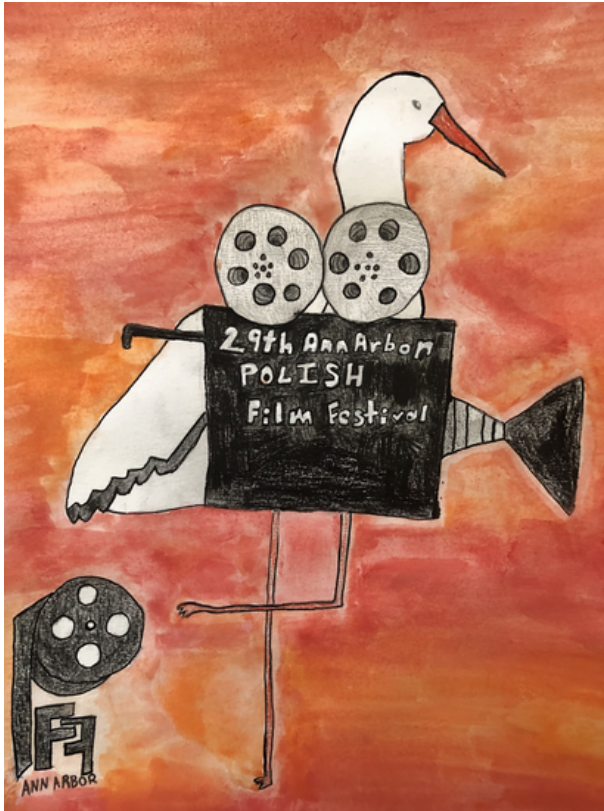

Organized by the Polish Cultural Fund (PCF), the festival will take place November 4th through 6th at a new location, the State Theater.

Winning documentary and short films will be announced at the Festival Opening on **November 4, 2022**. The directors will receive a \$500 cash prize along with the Festival Trophy. A selection of captivating films and a surprise guest will top the event.
