

After 9 years of dedicated work, the board members of the Polish Language Center of Ann Arbor (Polska Szkola w Ann Arbor) are stepping down.

The school has been the work of love for two founding board members: Board President Barbara Alvarez and Ildi Porter-Szucs, the Treasurer. The third board member and Board Secretary Marcin Szczepanski joined the board in 2012. All three are stepping down at the end of the 2019/2020 school year.

The Polish Language Center of Ann Arbor was founded in 2011 by parents whose dream was for their children to learn Polish. Over the years, dozens of amazing and hard working teachers and parents dedicated to Polish language classes have all made the school possible.

The School's primary aim is the study of the Polish language, the history and geography of Poland, and the continuation of Polish tradition and culture. The Center admits children from the age three and up, and offers various levels of instruction according to age and linguistic proficiency. The Center also teaches adult learners. The School is independently run and supported by parents.

New board, consisting of parents of current students, will take over in the summer of 2020.
